

Gospel Tracts



Gospel tracts are a proven way to share the good news of Jesus Christ. Paul states the gospel which we must believe in order to get saved.

“Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you **the gospel** which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that **Christ died for our sins** according to the scriptures; And that **he was buried**, and that **he rose again the third day** according to the scriptures: And that he was seen of Cephas, then of the twelve.” (1 Corinthians 15:1-5)

Gospel tracts should tell people that they are sinners and in need of the merciful Saviour. Jesus Christ died in the place of all sinners. Christ died for our sins. A sinner receives God’s gift of salvation when he receives Jesus as his personal Saviour.

Gospel tracts get read when someone is ready to read them. One way to proclaim the Good News of Christ is to leave appropriate gospel tracts in places people will find them. Here are some strategic places you might prayerfully place gospel tracts this week. You can leave gospel tracts: with a tip at a restaurant, in laundromats, put them in the mail with your bills, include them with birthday or Christmas cards, leave them in the doctor’s office, send them to the military, leave on airplanes, on buses, in a public restroom, in magazines, with items you donate, on public bulletin boards, in a shopping cart, at the coffee shop, in the hospital waiting areas etc... Think of your own ideas and place them in good places. Gospel tracts you share might even get read by more than one person.
